Preschool Assessment & Rating visit

Chapman Primary School has had an authorised officer from the Children's Education and Care Assurance visiting our preschool this week. This is a major component of the assessment and rating process for our preschool in accordance with regulation 63 of the *Education and Care Services National Regulations* (National Regulations).

During the past few days she has been observing the preschool teaching practice, looking at our learning environment, talking with the preschool teacher, educators and school leadership team. This process also requires the preschool and school to have many pieces of relevant documentation available for sighting as evidence of being compliant and operating a quality service. Jacinta has also observed the children participating in the indoor and outdoor program and enjoying their activities throughout the day. Chapman Preschool is committed to a cycle of continuous improvement and look forward to receiving feedback from the visit in Term 3.

Information collected included student's physical activity and nutrition behaviours, weight status as well as their attitudes to physical activity and general wellbeing.

The information collected will be used to inform and refine public health programs and policies in the ACT. The survey results will also help to plan and develop services that best meet the needs of ACT children.

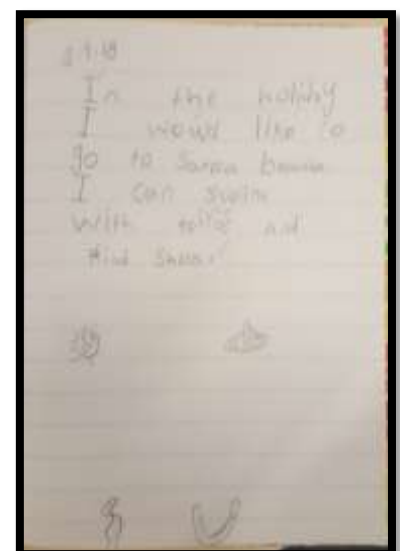
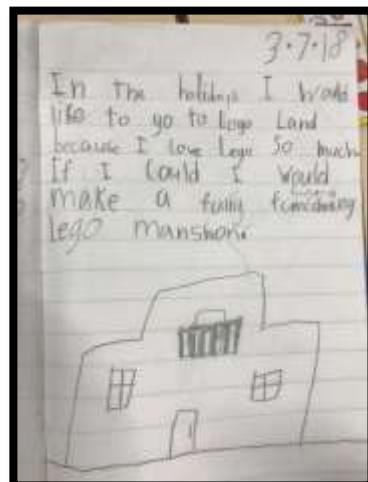
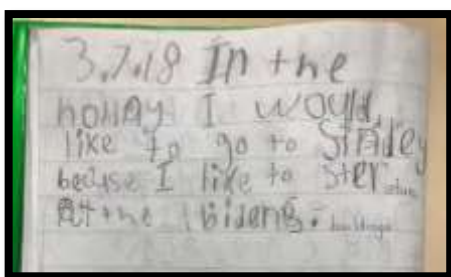

Year 2 – The Magic Beach

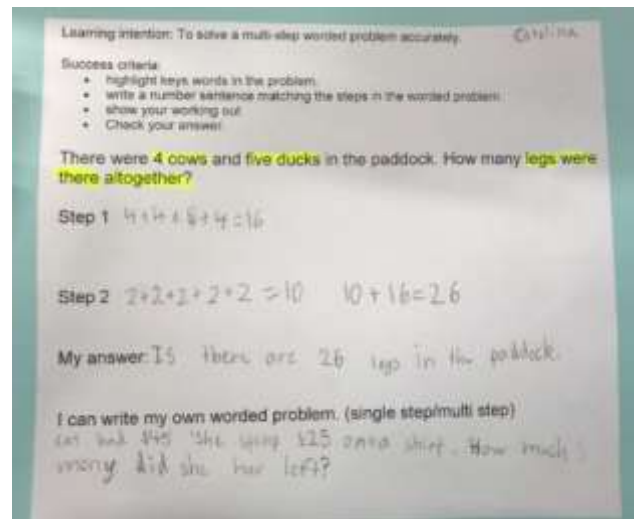
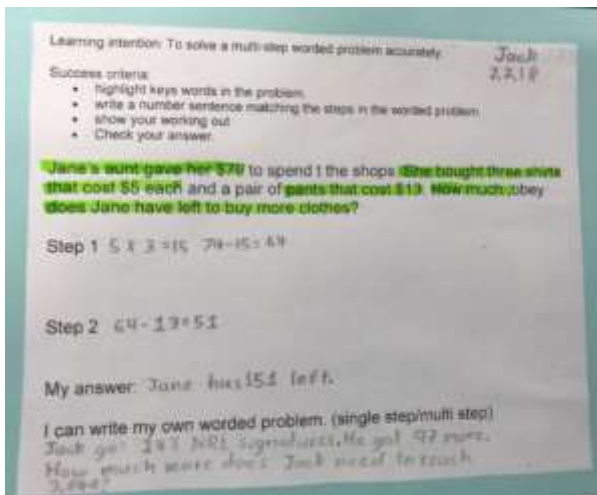
Thank you to all those who came to watch our Year 2 assembly in Week 8. We loved putting it together and thought the students absolutely shone on the day.

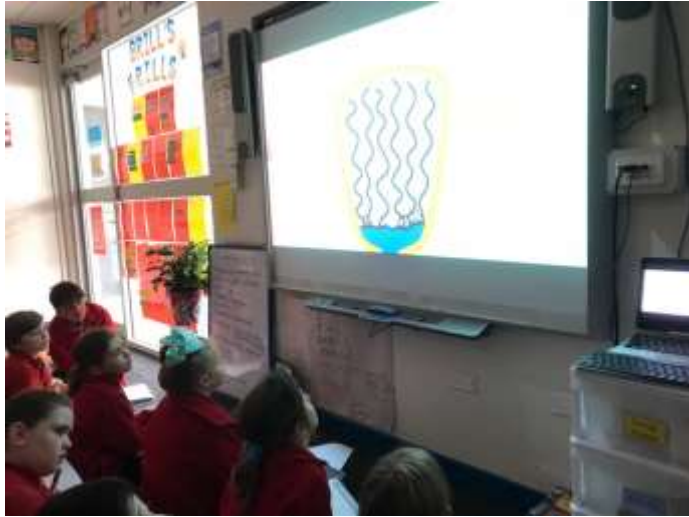
In our Maths workshops, students have been applying their knowledge of number to solve single step or multi step word problems. We are very proud of the wonderful mathematical thinking that the students are doing.

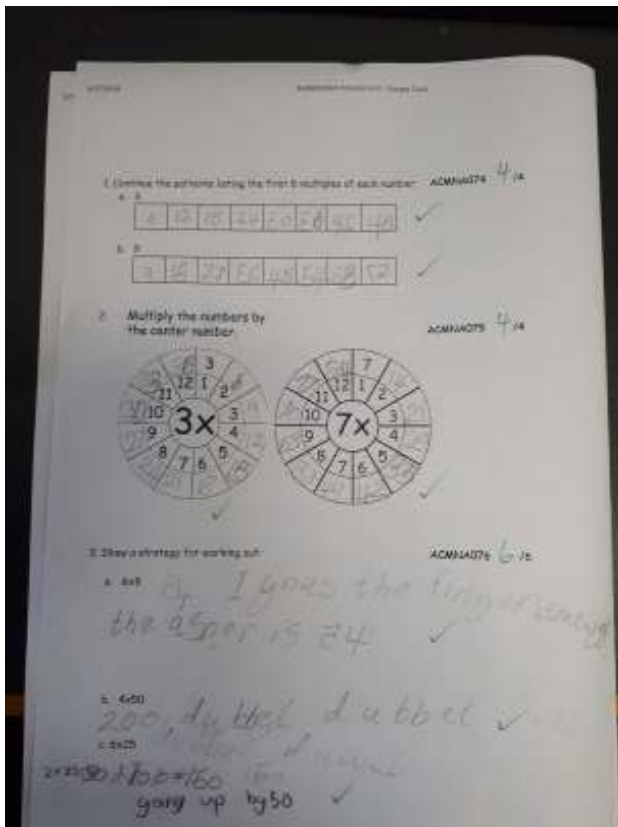

We wish everyone a safe and happy holiday and look forward to everyone coming back refreshed and ready to continue their learning.

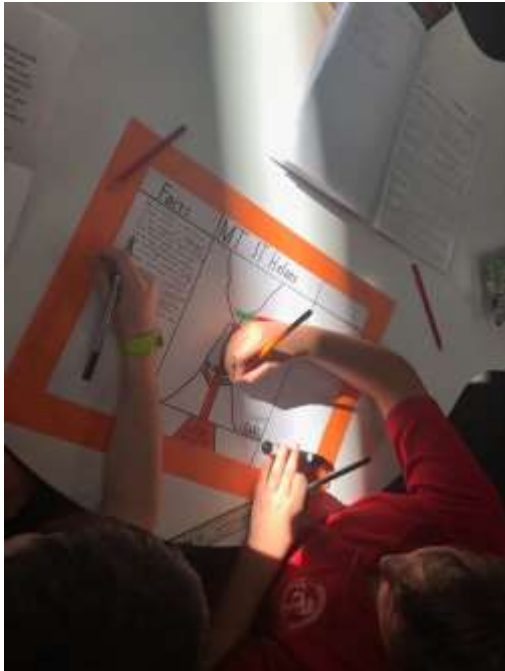
