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Principals Message

Dear Parents & Carers,

I would like to thank all of you for your trust and confidence in us to manage the education and wellbeing of the children throughout term 1. I thank our staff for their resilience and professional dedication to ensure the learning focus has been explicit and intentional whilst ensuring their own wellbeing and the wellbeing of the children at school.

Parent involvement that makes a difference in a child's learning

There are four key things that parents can do to support their child's learning to support our consistent message of improving the learning at Chapman School:

Having High Expectations

The research shows undeniably that high parental expectations have the greatest impact on student achievement. The positive attitude parents have toward their child's education, teacher and school is significantly related to increased academic performance. Further, parent involvement is significantly related to academic performance above and beyond the impact of a child's intelligence. High expectations at home support children's achievement.

Talking about school at home

Studies have shown that parents talking to their children about school and school activities at home, have a great impact on children's learning. Our Seesaw App is a wonderful forum which continues to frame conversations with families at home.

Positive attitude and good work habits

As students get older, the impact parents can have on their child's academic achievement declines. Parents can't teach their children everything they need to know, but the habits they encourage at an early age, have long-lasting benefits, through to High School. Parents can assist by helping their child develop a sense of personal competence, encouraging persistence, showing them how to plan and manage their time, handle distractions, and ask for help when they need it.

Reading with Children

Parents make a major difference by reading and talking about books and stories with their children, in any language. Parents can help build a crucial foundation for successful literacy through conversation and reading together, which develops the motivation to read, a greater level of comprehension, and strong oral language skills.



2023 ACT Public School Enrolments will open at 6.00 am on Tuesday 26 April 2022.

Lodged enrolments online at <https://www.education.act.gov.au/public-school-life/enrolling-in-a-public-school> for your child to:

- start in preschool in 2023,
- **Out of Area Preschool 2022:** some families who do not live in the schools PEA may be required to submit an enrolment application for kindergarten in 2023 (written advice will be sent to families who this applies to early in term 2)
- Progressing to **High School in 2023**

You DO NOT need to lodge an enrolment for your child to progress from one year to the next at Chapman Primary School e.g., from preschool to kindergarten unless otherwise advised, kindergarten to year 1 etc.

Families moving from Government to Private schooling should contact their prospective schools for advice.

Changes to Proof of Residency Requirements:

From 26 April 2022 all students starting at or transferring between ACT Public Schools will be required to meet a 100-points proof of residency check. Further information about proof of residency requirements will be available in the near future.



COVID-19 Messages, Updates and Reminders

Please continue to keep your child at home if they are unwell and get them tested if they have any of the following symptoms. If they attend school when unwell or become unwell while at school, they will be sent home as per COVID-19 safety directions.



COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

Main Symptoms of COVID-19:

- Fever or chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, loss of smell or taste, runny or blocked nose

Less common Symptoms:

- Muscle pain, joint pain, diarrhoea, nausea, headache, vomiting, loss of appetite, fatigue, unexplained chest pain, conjunctivitis (eye infection)

ACT Health updated factsheet: Testing children for COVID-19 using rapid antigen test: [Children and COVID-19](#) advised that COVID-19 testing is not recommended if your child has recovered from COVID-19 in the past 8 weeks.

What to do when your child has:

Positive Rapid Antigen Test (RAT)

1. Isolate for 7 days and follow the guidance at [COVID-19](#)
2. Register the positive RAT result with ACT Health using the [online form](#) and
3. **Contact the school** on 6142 2400 or via email at chapmanps.info@ed.act.edu.au

Negative RAT but has ongoing COVID-19 symptoms

- Have a PCR test
 - a. Positive PCR test follow the above steps
 - b. Negative PCR test return to school when well again



Death Cap Mushroom

Amanita Phalloides

The Death Cap mushroom (*Amanita Phalloides*) is a deadly poisonous fungus. They often grow near established oak trees, and are found when there is warm, wet weather. In Canberra this usually occurs in autumn but there is no specific mushroom season. There have been multiple incidents and fatalities associated with Death Cap mushrooms.

It can be extremely difficult for even experienced collectors to distinguish Death Cap mushrooms from an edible mushroom. **People should not pick or eat wild mushrooms**, and should talk to their families, friends and neighbours about the dangers of Death Cap mushrooms. Cooking Death Cap mushrooms does not make them safe.

Symptoms

Symptoms of Death Cap mushroom poisoning generally occur 6–24 hours or more after ingestion of mushrooms and include stomach pains, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.

Symptoms may subside for 1–2 days giving a false impression of recovery. However, by this stage the toxin will have already caused serious liver damage. Liver failure and death may occur.

Medical Treatment

Anyone who suspects that they might have eaten Death Cap mushrooms should seek urgent medical attention at a hospital emergency department. Where possible take a whole mushroom sample for identification. The sooner the treatment begins, the better the chances of survival.

Further information and assistance if poisoning is suspected can be sought by calling the Poisons Information Centre on 13 11 26 (24 hours a day, seven days a week).

COOLEMAN FARM NEIGHBOURHOOD PARK

The local park enclosed by Bertel Crescent and accessed by Perry Drive, Boucicault Place and Brough Place used to be part of the original Cooleman Farm. The Park is being upgraded to include a restored Playground area. In addition, Grants are currently being applied for by the newly formed Cooleman Farm Neighbourhood Park Volunteer Group. The plan is to include a Nature Play area, a bike track and a restored area of Box Gum Woodland. Links are being established between this park and Chapman Primary School.

Cooleman Farm Neighbourhood Park is fortunate in containing a Blakey's Red Gum estimated to be over 250 years old and a Yellow Box Gum. Both of these are remnant trees and part of the original Box gum Woodland which covered most of this part of the ACT. By restoring the Box Gum Woodland connective biodiversity corridors will be strengthened. The park will be revitalised as a place for intergenerational use and as a way of mitigating the effects of climate change.
